## **Update on the United Kingdom – Mexico Free Trade Agreement Negotiations**

I am writing to update you on the second round of negotiations on the United Kingdom-Mexico Free Trade Agreement (FTA). You will also note the Written Ministerial Statement that has been laid in the House today. The virtual round took place between 31st October and 11th November, where negotiators met across 29 policy areas in over 35 sessions during the course of the round.

Following changes in the Mexican trade ministry at ministerial and official level in the weeks prior to the round, the UK Chief Negotiator and her new Mexican counterpart opened discussions by reaffirming their commitment to a comprehensive and progressive FTA which better reflects the trading relationship we want to have in the long term. Both agreed that the bilateral negotiations were an opportunity to complement and add value to the UK's accession to the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), which Mexico supports.

Technical discussions built on the positive start made in negotiation round one in July. Positive progress was made in several areas, including Goods, Customs, Trade and Gender Equality, Financial Services, Small and Medium-sized Enterprises, and Innovation. Importantly, at this relatively early stage in negotiations, UK negotiators developed a better understanding of Mexico's positions and identified areas of convergence and divergence.

The Government is determined that any agreement must work for consumers, producers, investors, and businesses alike. We further remain committed to upholding our high environmental, labour, public health, food safety and animal welfare standards, alongside protecting the National Health Service.

The third round of official level negotiations are scheduled to take place in Mexico City in early 2023. We continue to engage with stakeholders to help inform the United Kingdom's approach to negotiations.

I will continue to update you as the negotiations progress. I am also continuing to work closely with the relevant select committees in both Houses – this includes the offer of a private briefing with the Chief Negotiator after each round. My Department and I are committed to being transparent and keeping Parliament appropriately updated on our ambitious trade agenda.
