I. MINUTES

The Committee *agreed* the minutes of the 1st meeting of the 2022–23 parliamentary session.

The Chair explained that Lord Bassam of Brighton confirmed that he is happy for follow-up to be carried out on the Select Committee on Regenerating Seaside Towns and Communities. The Committee *agreed* to conduct follow-up on this inquiry in early 2023.

2. SPECIAL INQUIRY COMMITTEE PROPOSALS

The Committee *considered* the 20 special inquiry committee proposals received from Members of the House.

Lord Blencathra recused himself from the discussion on Proposal 11, Procedures for scrutinising secondary legislation, as he was a co-proposer.

The Senior Deputy Speaker had to leave the meeting early and Lord Judge took the Chair.

The Committee *agreed* to shortlist the following proposals:

- Primary and Community care: reforming an essential NHS service – Lord Patel
- Reform of the English Secondary Schools System – Lord Baker of Dorking, Lord Aberdare, Lord Blunkett, Baroness Garden of Frognal, Lord Lucas, Baroness Morris of Yardley and the Duke of Wellington
- Tackling the problems of adolescent health – Lord Robertson of Port Ellen
- The evolving role of horticulture – Baroness Fookes
- Use of Artificial Intelligence in weapons systems – Lord Clement-Jones

The Committee also *agreed* to give further consideration to a follow-up inquiry on the Rural Economy Committee.

3. INTERPARLIAMENTARY FORUM

The Committee *noted* the paper by the Principal Clerk of Select Committees on the work of the Interparliamentary Forum.

4. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

The Committee *took note* of the Committee Office organisation chart.
