Dear Angus,

New measures tackling China's dumping of Aluminium Extrusions to come into force

I am writing to you to let you know that the Secretary of State for International Trade has today approved the TRA's recommendation that new anti-dumping measure be applied to Aluminium Extrusions imported to the UK from China.

The TRA's investigation, initiated at the request of the UK Aluminium Extrusions industry, found that imports are being dumped into the UK at unfair prices and causing injury to UK producers.

This was the TRA's first case instigated at the request of UK industry. As always, our recommendation was based on the evidence we gathered and analysed on this important industry.

The TRA's interim report, the [Statement of Essential Facts](#), published in May invited interested parties to comment. The TRA considered these comments and submitted a [final recommendation](#) to the Secretary of State for International Trade who agreed that the new trade remedy measure should be put in place on these imports in the form of a [tariff at the border](#). This tariff will come into effect from 17 December 2022.
