Dear Secretary of State

Congratulations on your recent appointment.

I am writing regarding the Government's failure to respond to e-petition [642809](#), entitled "Make XL Bully a banned dog breed in the Dangerous Dogs Act".

The standards for responding to e-petitions, which have been agreed between the Petitions Committee and the Leader of the House, state that Government responses should be provided within 14 days and no later than 21 days of being requested.

A response to this petition was first requested on 12 September 2023, and despite repeated requests, the Government's response is now over six weeks late. This is clearly not acceptable.

When a petition receives over 10,000 signatures petitioners are entitled to a response from the Government that directly responds to the request of their petition, and this should be provided in a timely fashion.

The Government has already announced its plans to ban XL Bully dogs, and brought forward legislation to give effect to this ban, so it is not clear what is holding up the Government's response to this petition.

I would be grateful if you could provide the Government's response to this petition, and an explanation for the delay in providing this, by no later than 23 November.
