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The Environment in focus inquiry process and next steps

The call for evidence

1. In September 2025, we issued a call to the environmental and climate communities and the public for ideas on what we should investigate next.¹ In the previous Parliament, a similar exercise saw the Environmental Audit Committee exploring the relationship between heat and health and considering how buildings should be adapted to rising temperatures in its ‘Heat resilience and sustainable cooling’ inquiry.² Other recent inquiries inspired by calls for ideas from the public include the International Development Committee’s inquiry into the Women, Peace and Security agenda,³ and the Science and Technology Committee’s 2022 inquiry into bacteriophages in the previous Parliament.⁴
2. We asked submitters in 250 words to set out:
 - a. what the Environmental Audit Committee should focus on next;
 - b. why it mattered, and;
 - c. what action was needed from the Government to address the issues identified in their proposal.⁵
3. The submission period for ‘The Environment in focus’ concluded on 10th October 2025. A total 203 proposals were received, of which 193 were analysed after removing duplicates. These have been published on our website.⁶

Initial shortlisting

4. The committee met to review the submissions received at a meeting held on 3rd December 2025 at which it was revealed that many different organisations had made suggestions in similar areas.
5. Five different subjects were shortlisted for presentation and examination in oral evidence to the Committee's oral evidence hearing on 17 December 2025.

Combining proposals

6. Ahead of this meeting, contributors who had suggested subjects which had been selected by different organisations met, to streamline their proposals and decide who would present at the 17 December meeting. We are grateful to have had agreement from each group to present a joint proposal where applicable, and thank the individuals and organisations included for their cooperation.
7. The agreed pitches and presenters, including references to those organisations who contributed to, and agreed a final pitch, were:
 - The environmental impact of data centres and artificial intelligence, presented by Miss Rowena Shivam, student of Sustainable Built Environment, Energy and Resources, University College London and CEO and Founder, BNG Smart;
 - Air pollution on the seventieth anniversary of the Clean Air Act 1956, presented by Jemima Hartshorn, Founder and Director, Mums for Lungs and Dr Nat Easton, Air Quality Researcher and Specialist Policy Officer, University of Southampton;⁷
 - The environmental importance of woodlands and peatlands, presented by Dr Chris Nichols, Head of Conservation Evidence and Outcomes, The Woodland Trust and Ms Sally Nex, Advocate, The Peat-free Partnership;⁸

 - Comparing the UK’s environmental regime with those of countries subject to oversight by the European Environmental Agency, presented by Ben Reynolds, Executive Director, IEEP UK and David Baldock, Honorary Fellow, IEEP UK.
8. We would encourage all those who put forward an inquiry proposal as part of the Environment in focus initiative to make submissions to any relevant inquiries in the future.

Proposal selection for an inquiry

9. We are grateful to all those who submitted ideas to us and who engaged with this process. We particularly want to extend our thanks to those who presented their ideas to us on 17 December 2025.

10. **CONCLUSION**

On the basis of the submissions we received, and the further discussions held on 17 December on five of these proposals, we have decided to develop and launch an inquiry into air pollution. We will launch this inquiry in the New Year.
